A) CSI3*

The foreign competitors are invited through their respective home NF.
The NFs will be informed on the respective rider's quota with the invitation.

1. Foreign and German competitors

The TOP 15 on the Rolex Rankings No. 85 (max. 5 per nation).

2. Further foreign competitors (approx. 25)

a) Invited Nations: AUT, BEL, DEN, GBR, NED, SUI, SWE, USA, reserves nations: IRL, NOR, UKR

b) The FEI has the right to nominate two riders.

c) - 50% of the competitors within TOP 600 of Rolex Rankings No. 85
- 50% of the competitors are open (ranked or unranked competitors)

d) In addition, 20% of the foreign competitors may receive a personal invitation (wildcard) from the OC through their NF. These riders must be selected from the TOP 600 of the Rolex Rankings No. 85.

3. Further German competitors (approx. 35)

Competitors,

- a) belonging to the German Olympic cadre jumping
- b) belonging to the German B-cadre jumping and are nominated by the federal trainer jumping
- c) up to 2 Juniors/Young Riders, who will be nominated in agreement with the organizer by the federal trainer jumping.
- d) up to a total number of approx. 25, competitors, either nominated by the federal trainer jumping or personally invited by the organizer to the following ration: per 4 riders nominated by the federal trainer jumping one rider can be personally invited by the organizer.

This number of competitors comprises also the riders acc. 1. and 3a-c.

4. German Riders (only for class No. 3,6,9 and for the Youngster Tour class No. 1,2,5,7,10)

Approx. 10 competitors, who are only allowed to start in the above mentioned classes, on invitation of the organizer and in agreement with the federal trainer jumping.

The number of competitors of the host nation will not be more than 60% of all starters.

Each competitor is allowed to start a max. 4 horses, incl. 1 or 2 horses for the Youngster-Tour. In the Youngster-Tour only 7- or 8-years old horses are allowed to start, which do not start in any other international competition. In the further competitions horses of 7 year or older.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting competitors („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

B) CSI Amateurs Cat. A+B, Equestrian-Sport-Club (Comp. 12-20)

- a) Foreign and German competitors, who have an Amateur Owner licence, who are a member in the “Equestrian-Sport-Club” and who have received a starting permit from the organizer. Each competitor is allowed to start with max. 3 horses, max. 2 horses in each competition.

- b) competitors of the CSI Amateurs are not allowed to start in competitions of the CSI3*.
- c) Only riders, who do not make a living from riding, dealing, training of horses and/or riders, on their own horses or on horses belonging to other family members are allowed to start.
- d) Holding the “Amateur Owner” status, does not bar competitors from taking part in other competitions or Championships. As long as the competitor has the “Amateur-Owner”-status, he is not allowed to start in a national or international events, at which the initial competition has a height of 1,50 m or higher.
- e) The Amateur-Owner Licence is issued by the home NF and must be applied before the show; for German riders to apply at the FN GER (Silke Zahel, Tel.: 02581-6362-236, Fax: 02581-6362-401, E-mail: szahel@fn-dokr.de) (costs: € 50 p.a.)

VI. FACILITIES OFFERED

A) COMPETITORS

Accommodation (bed and breakfast) competitors' expense in the official event hotels.

Meals (breakfast, lunch, coffee/cakes) at the expense of OC from Friday, 30.05. to Sunday, 01.06.08.

B) GROOMS

Grooms (1 groom per rider) of international starting horses receive free meal vouchers (breakfast, lunch and coffee from 30/05/08 till 01/06/08). Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the organizer..

C) HORSES

Stables incl. first bedding are provided by the organizer free of charge from 28/05/2008 to 02/06/2008; reservations have to be made by 29/04/08. Only the allocated stables are to be used. Hay, oats and shavings can be purchased from the stable manager if required.

If no box is reserved by 29/04/08, the organizer will reserve and invoice one box per horse entered. There are no boxes for horses not starting in this show.

D) WELCOME

The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC in order to facilitate them on arrival.

E) LOCAL TRANSPORTATION - ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOWGROUNDS

F) ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON COMPETITORS AND HORSES

Those competitors who are subject to VAT are asked to indicate it clearly on the entry form. A change of riders and/or horses during the event is only allowed in the jumping competitions between riders and horses of the same nation.

The declaration of the definitely competing horses as well as the competing rider has to be made by 6:00 p. m. of the previous day.

For withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows the competitor or the respective NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show.

VIII. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES/HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For questions pertaining to the veterinary and animal diseases legislation for horses from abroad and regarding the horses' transportation, the following horse transport company is ready to assist:

For customs and veterinary formalities for horses from abroad, the OC charges 35,00 EUR per horse.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every competitor is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Regulations 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 10th Edition, effective 1st June 2006

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"

General Regulations", 22nd edition, effective June 2007:

Art. 139.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 141.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 141.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 139.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

Under the Medical Control Programme (MCP) in Groups I and II, all samples collected in accordance with VR Art. 1017.1 will be analysed by Laboratoire Courses Hippiques, 15 rue de Paradis, 91370 Verrières le Buisson, France, Tel.: +33.1 - 69 75 28 28, Fax: +33.1 - 69 75 28 29.

X. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

The 8-10 best riders have to present themselves for the prize-giving ceremony of each competition.

The owner of the winning horse/pony is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix.

3. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 130.2 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts. Settlement will be done per competitor. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each competitor binds himself, to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the competitor. Acc. to § 50a Abs. 4 this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 10 % up to 500 EUR, 15 % up to 1,000 EUR, 20 % exceeding 1,000 EUR; plus 5,5 % solidarity fee of the income tax. The tax deduction has to be confirmed on demand. Those foreign competitors being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every competitor himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

4. INSURANCES

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

5. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. He also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

6. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping Department by the Foreign Judge.

7. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

International competitors receive free passes to the showground for all days. These passes can be collected at the office on arrival. One groom per rider and two owners per horse (acc to FEI passport) also receive free passes. Passes for the stable-area acc. to VR Art. 1005.2.5.

10. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Riders wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These riders will start first in these competitions.

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
